

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Target Group: G1-G2; G3-4; G5-G6 (rising) Three meeting Times: Mon, Wed, Fri or Tue, Thu, Sat at 4:30pm, or 7pm, or 900am Beijing Time; G1-G2: 1 hour per class; G3-G6:1.5 hour per class Program 1: June21-July 9; Program 2: July 9-July 30 Program 3: Aug 2- Aug 20

- G3-G6 will use History fiction books or Non-fiction history books; G1-G2 will use classic short stories or novels.
- The teacher will use the first 10 minutes to explain the historical background knowledge of the content of each class and ask challenging questions based on the content.
- The teacher will teach the reading of related content in the next 40 minutes. After a 5-minute break, the teacher will lead the students to conduct comprehensive understanding of the content, oral presentation exercises and writing exercises.
- Students will have an oral presentation in the last class. Parents are welcome to participate.
